RED BIRD MISSION SCHOOL REOPENS

A Story from Red Bird Mission 11/4/2010

"When we left here at the end of the [2009-10] school year, we didn't think that we would be coming back here. A miracle has taken place. We are back here. A miracle has taken place."

Those were the words of Mr. Mark Smallwood, Music Teacher at Red Bird Mission School, as he spoke to the opening chapel for middle and high school students on August 5 [2010]. Mr. Smallwood went on to share his list of "things I learned this summer."

- It's difficult to get up at 6 a.m. when you've been used to going to bed at 2 or 3 in the morning.

- It's easier to gain weight than lose it.

- It takes longer to get places in Puerto Rico because I can't read the street signs in Spanish.

- A right-handed person has more difficulty getting a splinter out from under a fingernail on his

right hand by himself.

- A pedometer doesn't work as it should after it goes into the swimming pool.

Mr. Smallwood said, "I also learned that God is faithful. When I prayed this summer that God's will be done for Red Bird School, I knew that God would answer, but I didn't know when or how. We kept praying all through the summer and didn't know if we would be here until last week. I learned that there is a reason that God put us here [at Red Bird School]. This year, I want us to be open to Him and give Him everything we can to discover what God has in store for us in a world that is at war with Him."

Then he read Proverbs 3:5-6, "Trust in the Lord with all your heart and lean not to your own understanding. In all your ways acknowledge Him and he shall direct your paths."

Mission of the Month

Each year specific missions are selected for giving. In addition our service projects such as the Fifth Sunday clothing drive and the sack lunch program support other missions which will be featured in coming months.

July Mission of the Month Mark & Rebecca Smallwood Redbird Mission School

Each year, Good Shepherd sends a love offering to United Methodist missionaries, Mark and Rebecca Smallwood, faculty at Redbird Mission School, Beverly, Kentucky. The students come from southeastern Kentucky counties in rural Appalachia where as many as half the children live below the poverty level and roughly half of the population has graduated from high school.

This school's mission is to provide high-quality K-12 and early childhood development programs in a Christian environment. Families pay tuition on a sliding scale depending on what they can afford. For many alumni, the school has been not only a gateway out of poverty, but also the place where they first read the Bible and encountered Jesus.

Red Bird Mission School nearly closed its doors for the 2010-11 school year due to funding challenges but donations and severe budget reductions allowed the school to continue to operate. (See accompanying article.)

Mark directs the music program for all grades and Rebecca is a fourth grade teacher as well as teaching Christian education.

We are in a covenant relationship with Mark and Rebecca Smallwood. This year we will be taking our love offering for them in the month of July. Our promise to the Smallwoods is \$900 and every year we have exceeded that amount. When a school has so little money that it needs to "shut down", our giving, no matter how small it seems, is important. Please use the mission envelopes at

church or mail your contribution to the church, identifying it for Mark and Rebecca Smallwood.

August Mission of the Month Joy-Southfield Community Development Corporation

The mission of the Joy-Southfield Development Corporation is neighborhood revitalization through family life-skill support and community economic development. Serving the Detroit neighborhood that is centered around Joy Road to the west of Southfield Freeway, this non-profit was initiated by Second Grace United Methodist Church and has become a critical tool in the rebirth of the area. Among their many services are a health clinic including preventative health education, free or low-cost home repair, youth mentoring and neighborhood and business improvement.

This organization provides the resources so that the residents can make this neighborhood a better, safer place to live. Some of the current initiatives include:

- Renovation of the 25 acre park, Stein Playfield. Through a partnership of grants and volunteer labor the park is being cleaned up and the athletic fields rebuilt so that the local schools and area sports teams have athletic facilities to use in their neighborhood rather than traveling to other locations.
- Local businesses are committed to improving their facades with the help of matching grants.
- Joy-Southfield is renovating donated houses for resale so that the proceeds can be returned to their home repair program.

Good Shepherd was active in this Detroit neighborhood last year with the purchase of a portable generator and numerous tools to support their home repair program. Last summer our youth worked in the neighborhood as part of their Motown Mission trip on an urban garden and neighborhood cleanup. In October, a number of our members dedicated a Saturday to clear a school route that has been overgrown for years. School students no longer have to walk in a busy street.

Stay tuned for an up coming opportunity to work with Joy Southfield to make a positive difference in Detroit this summer!

WAYS WE GIVE

At the general or church-wide level, United Methodists support ministry in three ways.

APPORTIONED FUNDS

The main way we support the ministries of the church is through our apportioned funds, a method of giving that proportionally allocates the churchwide budget to conferences and local churches.

For United Methodists this method of giving has become a strong, generous tradition.

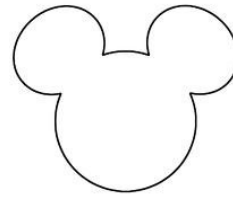
Together, through our connected congregations, we accomplish what no single church, district or annual conference ever could hope to do alone. In this way, each individual, each family, each congregation gives a fair share for the church's work. We combine our prayers, presence, gifts and service to make a significant difference in the lives of God's people.

The general funds include World Service, Africa University, Black College, Episcopal, General Administration, Interdenominational Cooperation and Ministerial Education.

SPECIAL SUNDAYS

The United Methodist Church designates a number of Sundays throughout the year as opportunities for recognizing and supporting particular ministries. These are referred to as Special Sundays and most include an offering used to fund the work of these programs. Special Sundays fall into three different categories:

Churchwide Special Sundays with offerings: General Conference, the legislative body of the church, has set aside these six Sundays for churchwide emphasis: Human Relations Day, One Great Hour of



THE CHURCH MOUSE

Disney attracts millions of people to its parks each year. Millions more watch its shows, buy its merchandise, and flock to its animated movies. What makes Disney different from all other competitors? Sharing, Native American Ministries Sunday, Peace with Justice Sunday, World Communion Sunday and United Methodist Student Day. Your support is critical to these important ministries that share God's gifts around the world.

Special Sundays approved for Annual Conference offerings: Four Special Sundays—Christian Education, Golden Cross, Rural Life, and Disability Awareness—are observed on dates determined by the annual conference, and the offerings are used for ministries within the annual conference.

DESIGNATED GIVING

In addition to supporting conference and general church apportionments, each of us has the opportunity to make gifts to specific ministries. One-hundred percent of your gifts to these designated giving opportunities go to the selected project. No administrative costs are deducted.

This is often referred to as “second-mile giving” because, in The United Methodist Church, the “first mile” is for local churches to fulfill their World Service and other apportioned funds and conference benevolence commitments. (We do this through the Spotlight Church Program.)

EMERGENCY RESPONSE

The United Methodist Committee on Relief (UMCOR) is the not-for-profit humanitarian agency of The United Methodist Church. Founded in 1940, UMCOR's mission is to alleviate human suffering—whether caused by war, conflict or natural disaster—with open minds and hearts to all people.

Goals (Yellow Sheet) Summary

Good Shepherd's mission is to meet the physical and spiritual needs of the community and the world. How do we carry out this mission and do God's work? We continued this discussion over the last couple of months with the yellow sheet survey.

A huge thank you to everyone who responded to the question regarding which goals are most important to Good Shepherd! The results were discussed at the June Leadership Council meeting and a summary is provided below.

Work on eight of the goals is underway:

- Implement a visitation program – an initial planning meeting has been held for a laity-driven program, participants have volunteered and a gathering is being scheduled to finalize the plan in advance of the first visits. We will be deployed in July to bring greetings from Good Shepherd.
- Highlight a "Mission of the Month." Check out the bulletin board at the Opportunity Center and the articles in the Fold.
- Establish a Drama Club. Initial discussion is underway to make this a reality. The results may soon appear at an upcoming worship service!
- Establish or refine the process for planning servant evangelism and service projects. (Originally listed as 2 separate goals.) A committee was formed to review our church committee structure to determine if any changes would be helpful. The target is to accomplish the church administration with minimal meetings so our service time can be focused on doing God's work!
- Review programs, ideas or actions of other churches to adapt into the culture of Good Shepherd. Several people have expressed interest in visiting other churches. We will continue to refine how to best learn from other churches.
- Greater emphasis on prayer. A prayer group has been initiated on Monday mornings at 8:00 AM.
- Establish a small group program. Potential leaders have been identified.

Although these items are underway, they are not complete. Your input and participation in the goals for which you have a calling and passion is critical!

Other goals receiving high interest include:

- Plan a youth or adult mission trip. A typical trip would require 1-2 years of planning and scheduling before the trip date. Where do our passions lie?
- Improve visibility of Good Shepherd through press releases, signage, website, Facebook, etc. Do you have a passion or talent for writing or marketing? We need help to ensure that people know about the great things that God is doing through this church!

Are you called to take the lead or to work on one of these goals?

Important goals but received lower interest:

- Review Christian education program for potential improvements
- Widen and empower church leadership circle
- Establish visitor feedback process
- Consider alternate services on less frequent basis.

We will continue to track and pray about these items.

Your prayers for guidance and inspiration are vital! Leadership Council will continue to plan actions related to these goals and others that arise. Your participation is always joyfully welcomed!

We are all called to be ministers. We all have special and unique gifts which could be the missing link in achieving God's work at Good Shepherd. Contact Pastor Kathy if you feel called to one or more of these items.
