### WORLD COMMUNION SUNDAY IS OCTOBER 2ND

“Being an Asian American in this culture, a lot of times I've questioned who I was and where I belonged,” said Paul Nielsen, an active United Methodist and World Communion Sunday Ethnic Minority Scholarship recipient. Paul attends Spring Arbor University in Michigan.

Born in South Korea but adopted and raised in the United States, Paul recalls times he felt he did not belong in either the majority or the minority culture. “But knowing I can always find my identity in Christ . . . that's given me comfort every single time,” he added.

Relating to others in his church, on mission trips and in college has helped Paul mature in his faith and his commitment to help others. Paul works as a peer advisor to new students at Spring Arbor.

“It's not so much a job to me as it is a privilege. I get to serve students and work with people because that's my overall passion,” said Paul. He is working on his Bachelor of Arts degree in psychology with a minor in business administration. Concerned about the decline in healthy marriages, he wants to become a marriage and family therapist.

Your gifts to the World Communion Sunday offering equips racial- and ethnic-minority students in the United States and international students to transform the church and their communities.

—50 percent of the offering goes to World Communion Scholarships, related to the General Board of Global Ministries. These are for international and U.S. (racial- and ethnic-minority) graduate students. At least half of the annual amount goes to ministries beyond the United States.

—35 percent of offering is for the Ethnic Scholarship Program, affiliated with the General Board of Higher Education and Ministry (GBHEM). This benefits undergraduate students.

—15 percent of offering funds the Ethnic In-Service Training Program, GBHEM. Racial- and ethnic-minority persons seeking second careers in church-related vocations receive these scholarships.

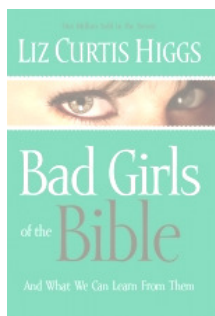
And of course, extending an invitation to friends, co-workers, neighbors and family to join you for dinner helps as well!

## October Mission of the Month

### Methodist Children's Home Society

The Methodist Children's Home Society (MCHS) headquartered in Redford has been providing care for Michigan's children since 1917. The residential treatment program provides intensive treatment for 70 boys ages 6-17 on their 72-acre campus. Licensed foster care is furnished for children birth through age 17 for children who have been temporarily removed from their homes.



Although every attempt is made to reunite children with birth families, MCHS also offers adoption services to place children into loving, permanent homes.

In 1992, MCHS developed BookPartners, an after-school mentoring program in Jackson, where children receive individual attention from volunteer mentors for both academic and emotional support. Because of the success of the program, it was expanded to Shaftsburg and Howard City in 2004.

## Our Special Assignment: Extend God's Kingdom

On August 28 a contingent from Good Shepherd attended the Detroit Renaissance District inauguration. The motto of the new district is:

### Being the Hands of God bringing Renaissance to Metropolitan Detroit.

Our new District Superintendent, Rev. Melanie Lee Carey, gave a message "Called to Build God's Kingdom." That is her goal for the 84 churches in the district to accept the call that first came from Jesus Christ to his apostles to carry the good news to the world, to love one another and to serve one another.

Her vision is that the district churches will be part of an exciting time. Words such as revitalization, revival, reawakening, rebirth, and resurgence should be part of our local church vocabulary. Imagine what the district could accomplish when that language is multiplied by 84?



Good Shepherd accepted a special assignment...To Extend God's Kingdom. We were entrusted with \$1,000 to invest in extending God's kingdom. Refer to the parable of the three servants in Matthew 25:14-30.

The money did come with some rules:

- 1) **It's God's money.** It can't be used to pay apportionments or light bills. It must be used to do God's work.
- 2) **Invest it in your neighborhood.** We need to figure out how we are going to define our neighborhood. What investment will extend God's kingdom? Is it meeting the physical needs of our neighborhood? Or is it serving the spiritual needs of our neighborhood?
- 3) **Report the results at the Bishop's Day March 2012.** We have six months to decide how to invest God's money and to implement our plan.

## What is our next step? PRAY!

Employ the Blue Sky thinking that Pastor Kathy references on the front of the September Fold. We aren't given many boundaries about how this money is used. Allow God to work within you to dream big!

Pray for guidance from God:

- Who is our neighborhood?
- How will we invest this money to extend God's kingdom?
- Feel God's presence and listen for His guidance.
- This is God's money....with God's help...we can produce a miracle for this neighborhood!

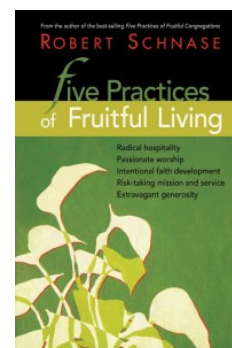
## Hearts Strangely Warmed Conference

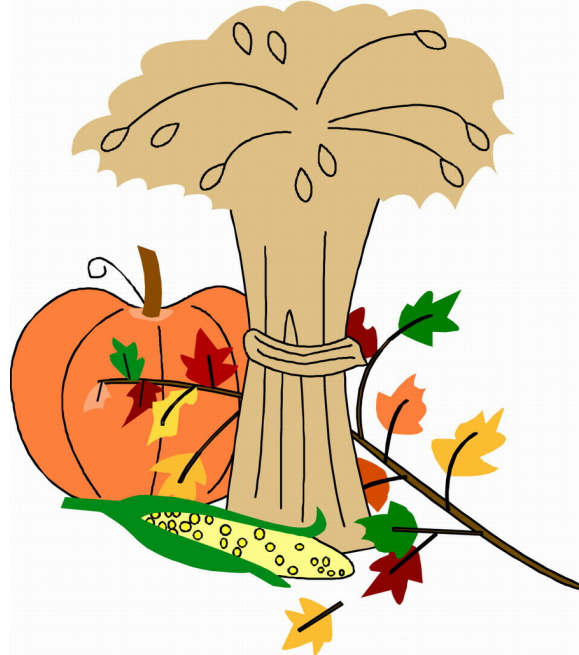
## LOGOS Youth Club
