Finance Facts

The season of Advent and Christmas is a time of preparation and joy that heralds the coming of Christ, as well as the end of the year for Good Shepherd Church.

We can summarize the financial status of Good Shepherd Church as being consistent with last year's financial performance. We had an actual income of \$87,702 versus actual expenses of \$112,304, with a \$24,602 shortfall. This compares to a \$25,800 shortfall at the same time last year. It is projected, with the income and expenses we expect from now to the end of the year, we should close out the year with a deficit of approximately \$5000. This is similar to last year's performance.

Also, we are to be congratulated and proud of the fact that Good Shepherd continues to "care for the flock" through special offerings totaling \$10,609 to date. For the first three quarters, Good Shepherd has given to support the Spotlight Church programs (\$4873), Haiti Medical Kits (\$1733) and Potato Project (\$3460) to mention a few. We are also making headway on the parking lot balance having started with a beginning balance of \$12442, receiving \$6302 in donations, resulting in a \$6141 remaining balance.

Our giving is slightly up compared to the same period as last year, with total income, (including interest, rent, and fund raisers, etc.) slightly less. Along with a small decrease in expenses for the same period, we are maintaining last year's pace.

Factors to be considered as we approach the end of the year:

1. We have received \$57,217 toward the \$63,202 pledged for the first three quarters, a 10% shortfall.
2. Without a rummage sale this year, there will be a several thousand dollar shortfall in 4th quarter income.
3. There will not be a Stewardship Campaign this year, but commitment cards are needed to reconfirm pledges for the next year. Cards will be provided with the 3rd quarter giving statements and will be available at the church in the lobby.
4. **With an end of the year rally and fulfilling our pledges, it is possible to end the year in the black.**

Thanks again to all for their continuing support. Your time, talent and gifts perpetuate God's work

and provides for the flock in Dearborn and worldwide.
